OUR HISTORY

The Humble Beginnings:



- Co-founded by a young female lawyer, 3 young attorneys and 3 female ex-police officers, who were continually confronted by a gap in the support network for victims of sexual violence;
- Spirit of Volunteerism, Work as a Family, Work from the Heart

Human Resources:

•10 paid staff in 3 locations, 2 on Upolu and 1 on Savaii

•Over 500 volunteer village representatives across Samoa who are our strength

OUR ACHIEVEMENTS TO DATE

Paving the Way:



- The Family Safety Act 2013 criminalized family violence
- The Crimes Act 2013 life imprisonment for rape; extended definition for rape
- The Family & Youth Court 2013 specifically for family violence
- The SVSG Advocacy Program for Offenders of Violence

Making it Count:



Samoa's population 180,000 people (2016)

From 2005 – 2016, SVSG's data revealed:

The lives we have saved:

- 8,532 Casework assistance
- 215 Rape case victims assisted
- 120 Attempted rape
- 116 Incest rape



- 1,212 Domestic violence
- 213 Child abuse
- 50 Attempted suicide
- 897 Children sheltered
- 105 Abused mothers sheltered
- 1,850 Disability & Elderly



Lives we have rehabilitated:

- 800 sheltered children successfully reintegrated to society;
- 713 offenders of violence successfully completed court referred programs with SVSG



The families we have reunited:

• Over 1,000 through counselling;

Over 300 through mediation



The people we have reached:

- Over 100,000 through the Help Line (25% potential crises, more than 2600 from women & children survivors of violence)
- Over 80,000 through Ending Violence Awareness
- Over 50,000 through "No to Rape" Awareness
- Over 10,000 through Gender Equality Awareness [Nofotane Project]



Justice being served:

 Over 200 sexual abused cases heard in Court with 90% success rate;

 Over 300 protection order applications for family violence set final by the Courts



The difference we have made:

- Mentality change;
- Community on the alert;
- Stronger communities established;
- Behavioral change




