Last year, with the help of our fellows, we trained thousands of young women across nine states. In 2017-18 we are tripling that number, expanding into 27 states.


YOUNG WOMEN 2 MAJOR EVENTS FROM COAST TO COAST

Thirty northern California high school students traveled to Sacramento to shadow 14 legislators. Assemblywomen Cristina Garcia and Catharine Baker welcomed them to the Capitol.

At IGNITE's first Minneapolis council meeting, participants heard from Representative Omar, the first Somali-American Muslim to be elected to office in the United States.






Councilmember Jennifer Gates, Dallas, Texas




Grady High School, Atlanta, Georgia
